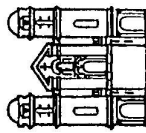

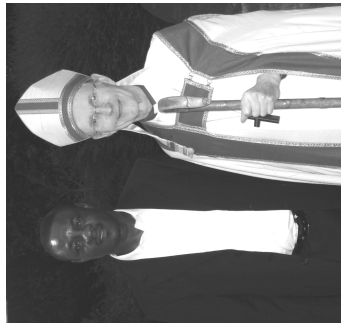

THE REVEREND JANE SHARP is to be a non-stipendiary associate priest at St James the Greater from the autumn. Ordained 11 years ago, Jane served a Curacy at St Andrew's, Aylestone. For the last eight years, Jane has been associate priest at St Mary's, Knighton – where she has had special responsibility for St Guthlac's. Jane is married with two grown up children and a daughter aged eight. She lives a five minute walk away from St James' – in St Mary's Road, off Victoria Park Road. Jane assists her husband in running a family business. Family and business commitments will necessarily limit Jane's involvement at St James' – something we have been used to with Jane's predecessor, Mark Battison, as a non-stipendiary priest. Nevertheless, in accepting the invitation to transfer her ministry to St James', Jane says "I hope to play as much of a role in the everyday care within the parish and the Sunday worship as I can".

Jane is very aware of the process of consultation with the congregation at St James' that led up to her appointment. She says "I am very sensitive to the fact that for some people this will be somewhat difficult and I will do everything possible to make things as acceptable as possible for them".

We can assure Jane of a warm welcome and look forward to all that she will bring to us.

VISITING LAMBETH BISHOP We are to welcome **Bishop Francis Mori of the Diocese of Chubu in Japan to our 10.30 service on Sunday 13 July**. Because he does not speak English and will be dependant on a translator, Bishop Francis will not preach, but be interviewed about his Diocese and what he hopes to gain from meeting with bishops from the Anglican Communion.

GOOD INITIAL RESPONSE TO THE DISABLED ACCESS APPEAL

As we near the end of the first month since the Appeal was launched, 33 individuals have responded with gifts or pledges (including Gift Aid where applicable) amounting to £15,191.

Events including two coffee mornings, a summer evening and The Sixteen concert have raised a further £5,114.
