**THE EXTENSION** incorporating a lift and flight of stairs to new facilities in the Undercroft was formally handed over to the church by the builders last Thursday. We owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to **Will Warner** who has seen through this project on behalf of the church from beginning to end – an intensive period of two years, including a frustrating year getting through all the ‘red tape’ of satisfying English Heritage and sundry amenity societies, and gaining necessary permissions. Then, when the building work began, Will made almost daily site visits – constantly smoothing the way for the contractors and all affected by the work going on – including the Vicarage! We thank Will for all of the time, patience and energy expended with unrelenting good cheer.

It so happened that the handover-day coincided with the last event in a series of fund-raising efforts over the last six months. This was a most enjoyable Christmas evening of carol singing, stories and poems brought together by **Margaret Terry**. This was very well attended and raised **£506**.

Our thanks to **Geoffrey Simpson** and **Tony Rudge** who coordinated the fund-raising drive which has been a great success both financially and socially. **A total of £65,000 of new money has now been raised towards the project.** There are some grant applications still under consideration and a Gift Day coming up on 14 February that will hopefully take us to the target of £100,000.




