The Vicar writes ...

SYNODICAL FOLLY!

Meeting this past week, the Church of England's General Synod hit the news on successive days in a way that I think amounts to a public relations disaster.

First, it was announced that members of the clergy and some lay employees were to be banned from joining the British National Party. How many people would this apply to? One or two pathetically misguided people at the most, I should think. But the general public are left with the impression that, without a strict prohibition, the C of E's clergy and lay officials would flock to join this nasty political party.

Next day, it was reported that the Synod had enthusiastically supported the aim of converting people of other faiths. If there is one thing guaranteed to weaken good relations between people of different faiths and damage social cohesion, it is fear of each religion actively seeking converts from the others.


Taken together, these two reports in the news give the impression of a Church with fanatically nationalistic, immigrant-hating tendencies, setting out to promote a religious monopoly. This is, of course, unintended and as far from the truth as could be.

I despair of the ineptitude of the General Synod in the past week. I hope that the Church of England's reputation for reasonableness, tolerance and broad sympathies has not been irreparably damaged.


