


ADVENT means 'coming' or 'arrival'. The focus of the entire season is the celebration of the birth of Jesus the Christ in his First Advent and the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent. Bible readings in Advent will reflect this emphasis on the Second Advent, including themes of accountability for faithfulness at His coming, judgement on sin and the hope of eternal life.

Advent is the beginning of the Church Year for most churches in the Western tradition. It begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day, which is the Sunday nearest November 30, and ends on Christmas Eve (December 24).

### The colour of Advent is Purple.

This is the colour of penitence and fasting as well as the colour of royalty to welcome the Advent of the King. The purple of Advent is also the colour of suffering used during Lent and Holy Week. This points to an important connection between Jesus' birth and death. The nativity, the Incarnation, cannot be separated from the crucifixion.

The Advent wreath is a circular evergreen wreath with five candles, four around the wreath and one in the centre. The wreath is symbolic, a vehicle through which to tell the Christmas story. There are various ways to understand the symbolism. The exact meaning of the different aspects of the wreath is not as



important as the story in which we are invited to participate, as well as to listen.
