Ascensiontide reflection

In bygone ages, the symbolism of the Ascension spoke clearly enough. In many a medieval roof boss, the Ascension is pictured by a group of disciples gazing up at a pair of feet!

We might scoff at a representation of the disciples gazing at a pair of feet as quaint, crude, pre-scientific.

But the influence of a modern form of primitive art – by such artists as Jacob Epstein, Henry Moore and Pablo Picasso – ought to make us cautious about dismissing the power of the primitive.

Truths are discerned in the primitive of an elevated kind which the sophisticated are the poorer for dismissing.
