Mike takes up his appointment as our Organist and Associate Director in mid-August.

THE ALZHEIMER'S SOCIETY will receive **£637.90** as the proceeds of the concert given by St James the Greater's Combined Choirs. Well done all!

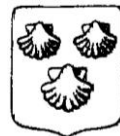
