JULIAN OF NORWICH On this day, in 1373, when Julian of Norwich was thirty years old and suffering from what was considered to be a terminal illness, she experienced a series of 16 visions, which revealed to her aspects of the love of God. Following her recovery, she spent the next 20 years of her life pondering their meaning and recorded her conclusions in what became the first book written by a woman in English, *The Revelations of Divine Love.* At an unknown point in her life, she became an anchoress attached to the Church of St Julian in Norwich. She died around the year 1417.


