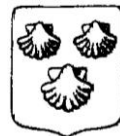
**Donations can also be dropped off during church office hours.**

**AN ICON** has been placed above the votive candle stand. This is a representation of the Holy Trinity by Andrei Rublev based on the account in Genesis 18 of three mysterious strangers visiting Abraham and Sarah. The three persons of the Trinity are shown to be in a community of love for each other and for all of creation.

**It is hoped that this icon may be a helpful focus for prayer and stillness at the centre of our church.**

**STOP-BY** – a Saturday drop-in for homeless people – is a joint project between the Islamic Society of Britain and the Church of St James the Greater and is supported by Action Homeless. The opportunity to socialise and have a hot lunch, provided by volunteers, runs from 11.00 am until 2.00 pm.
