TOYS ON THE TABLE – SPECIAL CHRISTMAS APPEAL Please bring new toys to services on Sunday, 2 December – for children in Leicester and Leicestershire who might not otherwise receive gifts at Christmas. The need this year is as great than ever – especially for gifts suitable for toddlers under the age of two and for teenage boys. There are particular difficulties in finding gifts for these very different age groups. Many toys – and especially soft toys – are not suitable for children under 36 months. Their needs are best catered for with stationery, wallets and gift sets for personal hygiene. **Please note that gifts should NOT be wrapped.**Cash donations are also extremely useful – not least that among unavoidable overheads is payment of a premium by the charity for public liability insurance. Also some available cash makes it possible for the charity to purchase well- aimed gifts for the age groups where insufficient presents are donated.


