"There'll be a lot of explaining to do ..." Archbishop of Canterbury – following the vote on draft legislation for women bishops

Anne Bloor, an elected lay member of the Church of England's General Synod (and sister to Julia Warner & John Sharp in our congregation) writes:

Why I voted against the Measure

This is not about the rights and wrongs of women bishops, it is all about keeping a promise made 20 years ago - namely to make provision for those who in conscience thought it was wrong to ordain women. When I was elected to General Synod I was very open that although I personally was fully in favour of women bishops, I would vote for legal and clear provision to continue.

Neither is this a discussion about women's rights. It is about finding a way for the church to change the legislation made 20 years ago to ordain women, putting in another piece of the jigsaw of women's ministry. Since that time, women have been a blessing to the church, serving in many parishes. They have become area deans, they have become archdeacons and Cathedral deans, including Dean of York Minster.

The measure before Synod reduced this promise of provision to a half promise and the very people for whom the provision was being made were all deeply unhappy. It is sad that the majority were trying to impose provisions on a significant minority, which obviously did not meet their needs.

I do not see why we should risk breaking our promise. Not only might we lose worshippers and celebrants from our broad church but we would lose the respect of the wider society too. We will command greater respect for the Anglican movement if we can be shown to keep our promises and to accommodate those with a deeply held theological conviction. This is, after all, what we are asking of society in an increasingly secular world.

I can see quite clearly why many people are mystified about the outcome of the vote but I am asking you to help send out the message that the church is looking forward to consecrating women as bishops, and we shall work hard to settle our differences and find a way for the whole church to move towards this end.

My vote was a vote to try and keep all parts of the Church of England together. If the vote had gone the other way, by the same narrow margin, it would be another group of faithful Anglicans feeling hurt at this moment.


We need to pray for each other.
