**THE ICON** placed above the votive candle stand for this season is among the best known in the Western World and is one of the oldest of its type.

It is known as the 'Mother of God of Vladimir'.

Child and Mother are cheek to cheek. The Child's arms are trustingly around the neck of his Mother.

The face of Mary looking towards us is full of warmth and human comprehension, but also with deep sadness at foreknowledge of what is to become of her son – as Simeon tells her: "This child is destined to be a sign that will be rejected; and you too will be pierced to the heart."


