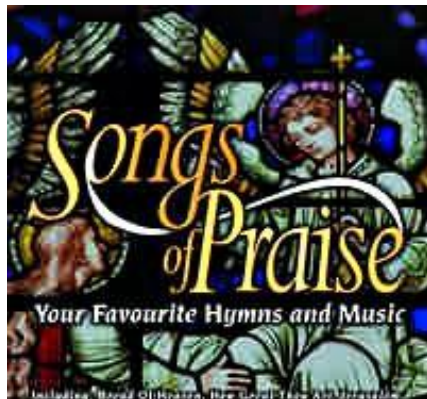

Ends of some rows of chairs in the nave have been taken out of use and other precautions taken to clear spaces below light fittings.

This follows the incident of a light bulb in the chancel blowing with sufficient force to cause the front part of the fitting to drop down.

This was a freak event – the one and only time such a thing has happened in more than 30 years. However, it has been thought best to be on the safe side until the light fittings can be modified to prevent even the remote possibility of such a thing happening again.

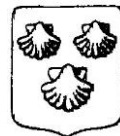
