THE DISASTERS EMERGENCY COMMITTEE have launched an appeal for the Crisis in Syria. Two years of war have had a devastating impact on many Syrian families leaving more than four million people in need of aid. In many parts of the country the health system has effectively collapsed, water supplies have been cut and food is in short supply. In addition, over one million people have now fled to the neighboring countries of Jordan, Lebanon, Turkey and Iraq. Refugees are arriving at camps which are already stretched to capacity, and many families are living in crude shelters they have built themselves, with host families in overcrowded conditions or in partially finished buildings. Retiring collections are being held after all services on Sunday 7 April. Please use a gift-aid envelope if you are a taxpayer, and make any cheques payable to 'St James the Greater Church'.

REVISION OF THE CHURCH ELECTORAL ROLL Every six years, Church Representation Rules determine that an existing Church Electoral Roll must be scrapped and a new Roll prepared in readiness for the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM). Therefore everyone who wishes to be on the Church Electoral Roll must complete a new application form. You must be on the Electoral Roll to be elected as a Churchwarden or Sidesman or stand for election to the Parochial Church Council. Application forms are at the back of the church; place them the box provided. Please return your form TODAY.
