CONGRATULATIONS to Chris Rees who ran the London Marathon last Sunday in 4 hours, 46 minutes. Chris has good reason to be pleased with this time since it is only a few minutes longer than the previous time he ran 5 years ago and better than 10 years ago. He raised £1,670 for LOROS.

His wife Hilary and sons Gareth and Morgan were there to cheer him on. A minute's silence was observed for victims of the bombing of the Boston Marathon earlier in the week. Hilary noticed a much greater security presence than in previous years, but also that supporters turned up undaunted in huge numbers.
