

- the scene is exquisitely depicted in the central panel of the main apse of our church.

You are recommended to take a close look at it. By comparison with the mural on the left, it is possible to work out the identities of Peter, James and John. The icon was probably painted by Diana Goddard, who also painted the murals. The surrounding reredos, completed in 1937, was carved by J H Morcom. Apart from satisfying curiosity, let this depiction of the transfiguration of Christ capture your imagination.
