#### **AUTUMN CONCERTS**

Saturday, October 12th 2013 – The Boyan Ensemble of Kiev – a compelling programme in which the first half illuminates the spiritual drama and splendour of the Eastern Orthodox tradition, while in the second, songs of joy, humour and nostalgia evoke the rick folk culture of Ukraine. Distinguished soloists feature throughout and there will be a special tribute to the Verdi Bicentenary.
