LUNCH AT ST JAMES Our next lunch will be on Thursday 24 May at 12.15pm in the Large Hall.

DAVID CLARK and Tor Bridge would like to invite you to a brief recital of the latest songs we have been practising. It will take place today, Sunday 20th May at 3.30 at 46 St James Road, Leicester LE2 1HQ. This will be a recital with a difference. We're performing the 10 Hermit songs by Samuel Barber, the American 20th Century composer (1910-1981). They last about 20 minutes in all: some are very short. Tor will introduce the songs with some explanations. There will be a short break and then we shall perform the songs a second time. Modern music such as this really needs at least two hearings. The poetry and prose set by Barber consist of mostly 9th and 10th century Irish texts, contemporary with the Book of Kells. They are descriptive of pilgrimage, of solitude, sometimes funny, sometimes naughty. *Please let us know if you are planning to come so we can find enough chairs on 0116 255 8988*.
